What is a

COMPREHENSIVE TRANSITION PROGRAM (CTP)?

An individualized program through a college or university approved by the U.S. Department of Education Federal Student Aid that allows students with Intellectual Disabilities the opportunity to work toward a career goal of gainful employment.




Individually planned supports and services include:

Integrated work experiences/internships



Extracurricular activities



CTP Facts

- Students with disabilities may enroll with either a standard high school diploma or an Alternative High School Diploma.
- 2 Financial Assistance is available (Pell Grants, Work/Study, KEES).
- Ourse modifications can include alternate class work and readings, alternate demonstrations of student learning, and modified testing formats.
- 4 CTPs are typically two-year programs leading to a University credential.
