


What is a **COMPREHENSIVE TRANSITION PROGRAM (CTP)?**

An individualized program through a college or university approved by the U.S. Department of Education Federal Student Aid that allows students with Intellectual Disabilities the opportunity to work toward a career goal of gainful employment.



Individually planned supports and services include:



**Academic classes
(for credit or audit)**

Integrated work experiences/internships



**Extracurricular
activities**

CTP Facts

- 1** Students with disabilities may enroll with either a standard high school diploma or an Alternative High School Diploma.
- 2** Financial Assistance is available (Pell Grants, Work/Study, KEES).
- 3** Course modifications can include alternate class work and readings, alternate demonstrations of student learning, and modified testing formats.
- 4** CTPs are typically two-year programs leading to a University credential.
